By the end of the school year, you should be able to say and do the following:

- 1—I can pronounce the Spanish alphabet sounds correctly.
- 2—I can pronounce printed text with 70% accuracy.
- 3—I can say the numbers in Spanish from 0-100.
- 4—I can greet people and say good-bye.
- 5—I can introduce myself and others.
- 6—I can say the date and time.
- 7—I can describe people and things by appearance, personality, and color.
- 8—I can express likes, dislikes, needs, wants, obligations, and possession.
- 9—I can ask and answer basic questions on familiar topics.
- 10—I can conjugate regular verbs in the present tense to say what people do.
- 11—I can describe weather and seasons.
- 12—I can talk about school and my classes.
- 13—I can talk about family and things I do at home.
- 14—I can talk about food.
- 15—I can talk about clothing, shopping, and places in the city.
- 16—I can use the present progressive to say what people are doing.
- 17—I can engage in simple conversations, provide and obtain information, express feelings and emotions, and exchange opinions.
- 18—I can recognize similarities and differences between Spanish and English languages, cultures, grammar, and punctuation.
- 19—I can identify cognates and use context clues to read and understand sentences and simple paragraphs.
- 20—I can identify Spanish-speaking countries, some aspects of their cultures, and consider the benefits of speaking Spanish.
- 21—I can comprehend face-to-face speech at a slow pace and understand the gist of basic conversations on familiar topics.
